FEE AND EXPENSE PRACTICE:

PER DIEM

\$1500 for grievance arbitration, grievance and interest mediation, interest arbitration and fact-finding.

CANCELLATION FEE

A cancellation fee of one day's per diem will be charged for each day of hearing cancelled or postponed within 30 days of the hearing date. Actual expenses incurred pursuant to the parties' agreement, such as nonrefundable airline tickets, are also payable.

TRAVEL AND MILEAGE

Travel time and mileage will be calculated from the Illinois/Wisconsin State line. Mileage will be charged at the IRS rate. Travel time other than on the day of the hearing, and actual costs, such as airfare, taxis, and lodging, will also be charged.

NOTE: The arbitrator shall not charge any fee other than the above stated fees.
