She first served on the Commission's staff of attorneys from 2005 through 2013. In 2013, Carne was appointed Chief Legal Counsel of the Office of State Employment Relations, the agency that establishes and monitors state government personnel policies and procedures. She was later promoted to serve as OSER's Deputy Director. She also served as the acting Administrator of OSER's Division of Merit Recruitment and Selection. In December of 2015, Carne returned to a Commission Staff Attorney position. From 2011 to 2012, Carne was Chair of the Wisconsin State Bar Labor and Employment Law Committee; from 2012 through 2013, she was a Fellow with the ABA Section of Labor and Employment Law, State and Local Government Bargaining and Employment Law Committee; and from 2011 through 2013 she was an Executive Board Member of the Association of Labor Relations Agencies.
