# DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Milwaukee District Council 48, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Board to conduct an election, pursuant to Section 111.70 of the Wisconsin Statutes, among certain employes of the City of Milwaukee employed in the City Development, and a hearing on said petition having been conducted at Milwaukee, Wisconsin by the Board on May 7 and 11, 1962, and March 7, 1963, at the City Hall, Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and the Board, having considered the evidence and arguments of the parties and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for said employes of the Municipal Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

# DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Board within ninety (90) days from the date of this Directive among all regular employes employed by the City of Milwaukee in the City Development, excluding confidential and supervisory employes and executives who were employed by the City of Milwaukee on February 1, 1963, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes desire to be represented by Milwaukee District Council 148, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, and its Local No. 428.



Milwaukee District Council 48 petitioned the Board to conduct a separate election among certain employes employed by the City of Milwaukee in the department of City Development. This request was contained in the petition filed by said labor organization, which petition also related to other employes of the Municipal Employer. The City Development is a separate department of the Municipal Employer. None of the parties raised an issue concerning the appropriateness of a collective bargaining unit consisting of only employes in the City Development. If a majority of the employes indicate a desire to be represented by Milwaukee District Council 48 and its Local No. 428, employes will have been considered to establish themselves as a separate collective bargaining unit.

The organization of the City Development is as follows:



# Eligibles

The parties agreed to exclude forty-five (45) positions as being supervisory and six (6) as being confidential and thus said fifty-one (51) positions are to be excluded from the eligibles to participate in the election. Issues existed with respect to Planner II employed in Long Range Planning Section of the Planning and Porgramming Division and Labor Foreman I employed in the Maintenance Section in the Technical and Maintenance Division. The Board concludes that the Planner II (LaBril) is not supervisory while the Labor Foreman I (Waech) is supervisory and therefore not eligible.

The following positions and incumbents thereof are to be excluded from the eligibles in any voting group:
