In its petition, the Petitioner described the Municipal Employer as the North Shore Water Commission, hereinafter referred to as the Commission. During the course of the hearing, an issue arose as to whether the Commission is a municipal employer within the meaning of Section 111.70 (1) (a) of the Wisconsin Statutes. The Commission is a body created as a result of an agreement between the City of Glendale, the Village of Fox Point and the Village of Whitefish Bay, pursuant to Section 66.30 of the Wisconsin Statutes, which provides that any municipality may contract with other municipalities for the furnishing of services to the residents of such municipalities. The City of Glendale, the Village of Fox Point and the Village of Whitefish Bay are municipal employers within the meaning of Section 111.70 (1) (a) and are municipalities within the meaning of Section 66.30 of the Wisconsin Statutes. They have contracted with each other in establishing the Commission to furnish water and related services to their respective inhabitants.

The Commission itself consists of three commissioners indi-

collective bargaining agreement covering the conditions of employment of the Commission, they act as agents for their respective municipalities and receive their authorization from their respective municipalities. Thus, in fact, there are three municipal employers involved in this proceeding and they are doing business jointly in the management of the Commission.
