ORDER AMENDING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

The Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission having, on November 30, 1967, directed that an election be conducted among all employes of University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, including stock clerks and storekeepers, but excluding clerical employes, library assistants, supervisors, managerial and confidential employes, administrative assistants, professional and limited term employes, who were employed by the State Employer on November 30, 1967, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether or not the majority of said employes desire to be represented for the purposes of collective bargaining by Wisconsin State Employees Association, Council 24, and University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Employees, Local 82, AFSCME, AFL-CIO; and on December 18, 1967, U-W-M Maintenance Local No. 1 Independent Union having filed a motion requesting that it be placed on the ballot in said election; and the Commission having reviewed said motion, and being satisfied that said Labor Organization should be permitted on the ballot,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within sixty (60) days from the date of this direction in the collective bargaining unit consisting of all employes of University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, including stock clerks and storekeepers, but excluding

clerical employes, library assistants, supervisors, managerial and confidential employes, administrative assistants, professional and limited term employes, who were employed by the State Employer on November 30, 1967, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether or not the majority of said employes desire to be represented for the purposes of collective bargaining by Wisconsin State Employees Association, Council 24, and University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Employees, Local 82, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, or by U-W-M Maintenance Local No. 1 Independent Union, or by neither of said labor organizations.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING ORDER AMENDING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Earlier in the year, four labor organizations filed petitions with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission requesting that representation elections be conducted among employes of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in four proposed collective bargaining units. On November 30, 1967, the Commission issued Directions of Elections among employes in two bargaining units and dismissed two petitions on the basis that the units described in those petitions were inappropriate. petitions dismissed had been filed by U-W-M Maintenance Local No. 1 Independent Union, wherein it proposed an appropriate unit consisting of Building Maintenance Helpers I, II and III employed by University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Said Labor Organization, during the course of the hearing on its petition, claimed to represent a substantial number of employes so classified. Prior to the issuance of the Direction of Election among the so-called "blue collar" employes, excluding craft, among others, the U-W-M Maintenance Local No. 1 Independent Union did not indicate to the Commission any desire to be placed on any ballot should the unit it desired be found to be inappropriate. After the issuance of the direction, and on December 18, 1967, counsel for said Labor Organization filed a motion with the Commission requesting to be placed on the ballot in the election involving said "blue collar" employed The Commission is satisfied that said Labor Organization has sufficient interest among the employes in said "blue collar" unit to be placed on the ballot and has, therefore, today issued an amended direction of election in the matter.
