Service Employees' International Union, Local 150, AFL-CIO, having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election, pursuant to Section 111.70 of the Wisconsin Statutes, among certain employees of Common School District No. 14, City of New Berlin, Waukesha County, Wisconsin; and a hearing on such petition having been conducted at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on June 3, 1969, by Allan J. Harrison, Hearing Officer; and during the course of said hearing, Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees, Council #40, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, having been permitted to intervene in the instant proceeding on its claim that it represents certain employees in the employ of the Municipal Employer; and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for certain employees of the above named Municipal Employer;

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within sixty (60) days from the date of this Directive in the bargaining unit

consisting of all regular full-time and regular part-time employees of Common School District No. 14, City of New Berlin, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, employed as custodians and cafeteria employees, excluding supervisory and confidential employees, who were employed by the Municipal Employer on May 29, 1969, except such employees as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employees desire to be represented by Service Employees' International Union, Local 150, AFL-CIO, or by Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees, Council #40, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, or by neither, for the purposes of conferences and negotiations with the above named Municipal Employer on questions of wages, hours and conditions of employment.

Because of the fact that the school year is about to close and the employees will not be working their normal hours during the school vacation period at such time as the vote is conducted, and because the parties could not agree as to the means of advising the employees as to the coming vote or as to whether the employees should vote by mail or otherwise, the Commission has determined to conduct the election by mail ballot. As a result the Municipal Employer is being requested to furnish the Commission, within ten (10) days of the receipt of a copy of this Direction, a list of the names and home addresses of the employees in the bargaining unit in order that the Commission may send each employee a notice of the election and a ballot upon which to designate his choice with respect to representation. Prior to the mailing of such materials to the employees the Commission will advise the representatives of the parties the procedures adopted by the Commission for the conduct of the mail ballot.
