## DIRECTION OF ELECTIONS

Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election pursuant to Section 111.70 of the Wisconsin Statutes, among certain employes of Dunn County employed in the Social Services Department; and a hearing on such petition having been conducted on September 16, 1969, at Menomonie, Wisconsin, by Edward B. Krinsky, Hearing Officer; and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that questions have arisen concerning representation for certain employes of the above Municipal Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

### DIRECTED

That elections by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within sixty (60) days from the date of this Directive in the following appropriate collective bargaining units:

## UNIT NO. 1

All Social Workers, including the Basic Services Supervisor, employed by Dunn County in the Social Services Department, but excluding all other employes and the Director of the Social Services Department, who were employed by the Municipal Employer on September 18, 1969, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of

determining whether or not a majority of such employes desire to be represented by Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees for the purposes of conferences and negotiations with the above named Municipal Employer on questions of wages, hours and conditions of employment.

# UNIT NO. 2

All non-professional employes employed by Dunn County in the Social Services Department, excluding all Social Workers, the Basic Services Supervisor and the Director of the Social Services Department, who were employed by the Municipal Employer on September 18, 1969, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether or not a majority of such employes desire to be represented by Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees for the purposes of conferences and negotiations with the above named Municipal Employer on questions of wages, hours and conditions of employment.

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### MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTIONS

In its petition the Union claimed as the appropriate collective bargaining unit "all employes excluding the department head", and stated also that the "claimed bargaining unit does not include any craft employes." The eligibility list submitted by the parties at the hearing indicated that the proposed unit would include both professional employes, i.e. Social Workers and non-professional employes. The Commission has concluded previously that Social Workers, because of their substantial period of study and training, and because of the requirements of the position, are professional employes, and are considered by the Commission as falling within the definition of the term "craft" within the meaning of Section 111.70(4)(d).1/

The Commission therefore has directed that two elections be held, the first in a unit of all Social Workers in the Department, including the Basic Services Supervisor, but excluding the Director of the Social Services Department; and the second consisting of all non-professional employes in the Department, excluding all Social Workers, the Basic Services Supervisor and the Director of the Social Services Department. 2/Dated at Madison, Wisconsin, this 18th day of September, 1969.
