DIRECTION OF ELECTION

The Labor organization and the Municipal Employer named above having filed a stipulation with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, requesting the Commission to conduct an election among certain employees of the above named Municipal Employer, pursuant to Section 111.70(4)(d) of the Municipal Employment Relations Act; 1/

NOW, THEREFORE, it is


DIRECTED


That an election by secret ballot be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission in a voting group of certain unrepresented teacher aides and federally funded employees who were employed on January 3, 1980, except such employees as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether the required number of such employees desire to be included in an existing collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time and regular part-time clerical, custodial, maintenance and teacher aide employees (as determined by the WERC in its November 10, 1978 decision), 2/ but excluding supervisory, professional and confidential employees, which unit is presently represented by Madison City Employees Local 60, AFSCME, AFL-CIO.

- 1/ The instant proceeding was initiated by a petition filed by the Union for clarification of an existing bargaining unit. However, prior to any further action by the Commission, the parties executed a Stipulation for Election.
- 2/ Decision No. 14392-A. The parties agree, consistent with said decision that the Superintendent's secretary, the Business Manager's secretary, the Bookkeeper, and Purchasing Clerk, as well as certain other employees, are appropriately excluded from said unit.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION


In accordance with the parties' stipulation to this effect, certain teacher aides and federally funded employees (Teacher Aides-Instructional; Title I and Teacher Aides-Special Education) shall vote on whether to be included as part of an existing unit of clerical, custodial, maintenance and teacher aide employees employed by the Municipal Employer, which unit is presently represented by Madison City Employees Local 60, AFSCME, AFL-CIO.


If a majority of the eligible employees vote in favor of inclusion in said unit, the Commission will issue an order modifying the existing bargaining unit description to reflect the inclusion of said employees.
