ORDER CLARIFYING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UNIT

Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, having filed a petition with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission requesting that the Commission clarify the existing bargaining unit consisting of certain employes of the Eau Claire Board of Education, Eau Claire, Wisconsin, specifically whether the position of Audio-Visual Technician, a newly created position, should or should not be included in the bargaining unit mutually established by the parties as consisting of "head custodians, maintenance men, school lunch drivers, garbage haulers, custodians, warehousemen and matrons"; and hearing on said petition having been held at Eau Claire, Wisconsin, on April 13, 1970, before Edward B. Krinsky, Hearing Officer; and the Commission having reviewed the evidence and the arguments of the parties, and being fully advised in the premises, makes and issues the following

ORDER

That the newly created position of Audio-Visual Technician is not included in the existing collective bargaining unit as established by the parties.





We have therefore determined that the newly created position Audio-Visual Technician is not included in the existing collective bargaining unit and therefore as a result will not be covered by the terms of the existing agreement. However, there is nothing to prevent the parties from attempting to come to some agreement with respect to the inclusion of the position in the existing unit and to the wages, hours and conditions of employment of the employee occupying said position.
