## ORDER DETERMINING THAT UNIT VOTES AND REPRESENTATION VOTES BE HELD ON SEPARATE DATES

The Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission heretofore, and on August 11, 1970, directed elections to be held among certain employes of Spooner Joint School District #1, Spooner, Wisconsin, employed in three separate voting groups, to determine whether the employes employed in said voting groups desire to establish separate bargaining units, and whether the employes therein desire to be represented for the purposes of collective bargaining by Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees, AFSCME, AFL-CIO; and thereafter, and on September 8, 1970, the Commission having issued an Order wherein it ordered that employes who are employed in more than one voting group on a regular full-time basis were eligible to participate in the elections in the voting groups in which they are so employed; and the Commission having, on September 4, 1970, forwarded Notices to the parties with respect to the conduct of the elections, said Notices indicating that the unit votes and representation votes would be conducted simultaneously; and the Commission now being satisfied, because of the nature of the balloting, there may be confusion among the employes resulting from the simultaneous conduct of the unit and representation balloting, that the balloting with respect to unit

determination should be conducted on a date separate and apart from the date of the balloting to be conducted for the choice of representative;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

## ORDERED

That the Notices of Elections previously issued by the Commission be set aside, and if posted by the Employer, should be removed; and further, that the copies of the Notices which are included in the Memorandum attached hereto now be posted by the Employer.

## MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING ORDER DETERMINING THAT UNIT VOTES AND REPRESENTATION VOTES BE HELD ON SEPARATE DATES

Because of the unusual conditions involved in this proceeding, namely, the fact that certain employes are regularly employed in more than one voting group, the Commission is now satisfied that if the unit votes and representation votes were conducted simultaneously, there would be confusion and problems arising therefrom, e.g. an employe who is eligible to vote in Voting Group No. 1 (Bus Drivers) and in Voting Group No. 2 (Custodial Employes) has an opportunity to vote on the unit question in both voting groups. The same employe would be given two representation ballots. There would be no problem with respect to representation ballots of this employe if separate units were established in both voting groups, the employe is only entitled to cast one representation ballot.

Therefore, we have determined to first conduct the vote on the unit determination on a day separate and apart from the vote on representation. When the units are established and certified, the Commission will arrange for the conduct of the representation vote, and there should be no question as to the employes eligible to cast representation ballots in the various units established. It should be made clear that if

employes in only one voting group vote to establish a separate unit, then the remaining two voting groups become automatically a separate bargaining unit. If two of the voting groups vote to establish separate bargaining units, the employes in the third voting group, although they may reject a separate unit, automatically constitute themselves as a separate unit because of the results of the unit votes in the other voting groups.
