DIRECTION OF ELECTION

The labor organization and the municipal employer named above having filed a stipulation with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission requesting the Commission to conduct an election among certain employees of the above-named municipal employer, pursuant to Sec. 111.70(4)(d) of the Municipal Employment Relations Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is


DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission in the voting unit consisting of all mechanics employed by the Public Works Department of the City of Middleton, excluding all office clerical, professional, craft, confidential, managerial and supervisory employees and all other employees, who were employed on April 6, 1984, except such employees as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining of whether the required number of such employees desire to be represented by Dane County, Wisconsin Municipal Employees Local 60, AFSCME, AFL-CIO as part of the existing bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time and regular part-time employees employed by the Public Works Department of the City of Middleton, excluding office clerical, professional, craft, confidential, managerial and supervisory employees, for purposes of collective bargaining with the City of Middleton.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Dane County, Wisconsin Municipal Employees Local 60, AFSCME, AFL-CIO seeks an election among mechanics employed by the City of Middleton Public Works Department, who are not currently included in an existing collective bargaining unit represented by said organization. The municipal employer has stipulated to such an election.


If the residual bargaining unit of mechanics elects to be represented by Petitioner, the unit involved herein shall be merged with the existing collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time and regular part-time employees employed by the Public Works Department of the City of Middleton, excluding office clerical, professional, craft, confidential, managerial and supervisory employees. Terms and conditions of any existing collective bargaining agreement, however, shall not automatically be applied to employees in the residual unit unless collective bargaining produces such a result.
