DIRECTION OF ELECTION

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

During the course of the hearing Counsel for the Employer contended that the unit involved herein was inappropriate inasmuch as it consisted of one employe. The Commission has consistently held elections in collective bargaining units consisting of one employe on the basis that an individual employe may engage in concerted activity along with similar employes of other employers, and that the concerted activity need not necessarily be limited to one employer. 1/
