The Employer asks that the Commission reconsider its policy of not requiring a formal showing of interest in support of petitions for elections where there is no existing bargaining representative, and dismiss the instant petition. In the alternative, the Employer urges that the Commission adopt a policy whereby the "good faith of the petitioner" would be a criterion in determining whether to conduct an election. Maving carefully studied the Employer's arguments in this regard, however, the Commission remains satisfied that it need not deviate from its normal practice. 1/
