DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Lodge 173, International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers, AFL-CIO, having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election pursuant to Section 111.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes among certain employes of Robb Motors, Inc., Eau Claire, Wisconsin; and a hearing on such petition having been conducted on June 8, 1972, at Eau Claire, Wisconsin by Commissioner Zel S. Rice II, and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for certain employes of said Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission among all mechanics employed by Robb Motors, Inc., Eau Claire, Wisconsin, but excluding supervisory personnel and all other employes, who were employed by the Employer on June 7, 1972, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes voting desire to be represented for the purposes of collective bargaining by Lodge 173, International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers, AFL-CIO.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Durin, the course of the hearing a question arose as to whether bonald bartilson is a supervisory employe within the meaning of the Act, and, therefore, whether he should be excluded from the bargaining unit. On June 16, 1972, the Employer, by its Counsel, in writing, advised the Commission that Mr. Bartilson indicated that he no longer desired to take any responsibility as a service manager and that he desires to be a mechanic, and that as of Monday, June 12, 1972, bartilson was so classified. Therefore, the issue is now moot, and the eligibles in the unit are Donald Bartilson, Steven Winger and Randy Sahein.
