DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Local 587, affiliated with Milwaukee District Council 48, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, having filed a petition with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election, pursuant to Section 111.70, among certain employes of District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education; and a hearing on such petition having been conducted at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on May 17, 1972, Zel S. Rice II, Commissioner, being present; and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that questions concerning appropriate units and representation have arisen involving certain employes of the above named Municipal Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That elections by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within sixty (60) days from the date of this Directive in the following voting groups:

VOTING GROUP NO. 1

All cafeteria employes, and teacher aides except those included in the unit of para-professionals, but excluding supervisory, managerial, craft, and all other employes, who were employed on September 6, 1972, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes desire to accrete to a presently existing bargaining unit consisting of all employes of District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education classified as Clerk I, II, III, Stores Clerk I, II, III, Clerk Typist I, II, III, Clerk Stenographer I, II, III, Student Service Coordinator I, Key Punch Operator I, II, Telephone Operator, Maintenance Worker I, II, III, Assistant Stage Manager, Security Officer, Engineering Aide, Foundry Helper, Custodial Worker I, II, III, Public Service Assistant, Audio Visual Aides Assistant, Bindery Assistant Trainee, and Bindery Assistant I and II, excluding supervisory personnel, craft employes, professional employes, technical employes, confidential employes and student interns subsidized by federal funds.

VOTING GROUP NO. 2

All technical employes employed by District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, but excluding certificated, supervisory, managerial, craft and all other employes, who were employed on September 6, 1972, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes desire to be represented by Local 587, affiliated with Milwaukee District Council 48, AFSCME, AFL-CIO.

VOTING GROUP NO. 3

All non-certificated professional employes employed by District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, but excluding certificated, supervisory, managerial, confidential, craft and all other employes, who were employed on September 6, 1972, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining (1) whether a majority of such employes desire to be included in one single bargaining unit set forth in Voting Group No. 2 above; and, (2) whether a majority of such employes desire to be represented by Local 587, affiliated with Milwaukee District Council 48, AFSCME, AFL-CIO.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

In its petition initiating the instant proceeding the Union sought a residual unit consisting of all unrepresented employes of the Employer, excluding certificated employes, craft employes, teaching professionals and confidential and supervisory employes. The presently unrepresented employes consist of cafeteria employes, teachers aides not included in the unit of teaching para-professionals, non-certificated professional employes and technical employes. Both Local 587 and the Employer agreed that the cafeteria employes, and the teachers aides not included in the unit of teaching para-professionals should have the opportunity to accrete to the bargaining unit presently represented by the Union and consisting of all employes of District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education classified as Clerk I, II, III, Stores Clerk I, II, III, Clerk Typist I, II, III, Clerk Stenographer I, II, III, Student Service Coordinator I, Key Punch Operator I, II, Telephone Operator, Maintenance Worker I, II, III, Assistant Stage Manager, Security Officer, Engineering Aide, Foundry Helper, Custodial Worker I, II, III, Public Service Assistant, Audio Visual Aides Assistant, Bindery Assistant Trainee and Bindery Assistant I, II, excluding supervisory personnel, craft employes, professional employes, technical employes, confidential employes and student interns subsidized by federal funds.1/ The Commission has directed an election among the cafeteria employes and teachers aides not included in the unit of teaching para-professionals 2/ to determine whether they desire to accrete to the bargaining unIt now represented by Local 587.

During the course of the hearing the Union indicated it also desired to represent the technical and non-certificated professional employes. During the course of the hearing the parties stipulated to the appropriateness of the unit described in Voting Group No. 2. Section 111.70(4)(d)2a permits the establishment of separate units of craft and professional employes and also permits craft and professional employes to indicate their desire to be included in a unit with non-professional or non-craft employes. The Commission has directed an election among the technical employes to determine whether they desire to be represented by the Union for the purpose of collective bargaining, and further it has directed elections among the non-certificated professional employes to determine whether such professional employes desire to be included in the unit with technical employes and whether they desire to be represented for the purposes of collective bargaining by the Union.

The representation ballots cast by the non-certificated professional employes will be impounded by the Commission agent who conducts the balloting. The sequence of counting the ballots would be as follows:

l. The ballots cast by the employes in Voting Group No. 1 will be tallied first. Should the cafeteria, and teachers aides not included in the unit of teaching para-professionals, vote to accrete to the unit now represented by Local 587, the appropriate bargaining unit shall consist of all employes of District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education classified as Clerk I, II, III, Stores Clerk I, II, III, Clerk Typist, I, II, III, Clerk Stenographer I, II, III,

Student Service Coordinator I, Key Punch Operator I, II, Telephone Operator, Maintenance Worker I, II, III, Assistant Stage Manager, Security Officer, Engineering Aide, Foundry Helper, Custodial Worker I, II, III, Public Service Assistant, Audio Visual Aides Assistant, Bindery Assistant Trainee, Bindery Assistant I, II, all cafeteria employes, and all teachers aides except those included in the unit of teaching para-professionals, but excluding supervisory personnel, craft employes, professional employes, technical employes, confidential employes and student interns subsidized by federal funds. Should the employes in Voting Group No. 1 not vote in favor of accreting to such present unit, then the present unit shall remain as is.

- 2. The ballots cast by the non-certificated professional employes as to their desire to be included in the technical unit will then be tallied.
- 3. If a majority of the non-certificated professional employes vote in favor of being included in a unit with the technical employes, the Commission agent will co-mingle their representation ballots with the ballots of the technical employes in such manner so as to protect the secrecy of the ballots. After the ballots are co-mingled, the ballots cast by the non-certificated professional employes and those cast by the technical employes shall be tallied together and the representation ballots cast by both the non-certificated professional employes and the technical employes shall be tallied together.
- 4. If a majority of the eligible non-certificated professional employes do not vote in favor of inclusion in a unit with the technical employes, the representation ballots of the non-certificated professional employes and of the technical employes will be tallied separately.

Should the non-certificated professional employes vote for inclusion in the technical unit, the appropriate bargaining unit shall consist of all technical employes and all non-certificated professional employes employed by District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, but excluding certificated, supervisory, managerial, craft and all other employes. Should the non-certificated professional employes reject inclusion in the technical unit, then there shall be two separate appropriate units consisting of (1) all technical employes employed by District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, but excluding certificated, supervisory, managerial, craft and all other employes; and, (2) all non-certificated professional employes employed by District #9 Area Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education, but excluding certificated, supervisory, managerial, confidential, craft and all other employes.
