The above proceeding for review of an administrative decision having come on for hearing before the Court on November 9, 1973, the Honorable Gordon Myse, Circuit Judge, presiding; Appleton Memorial Hospital, petitioner, appearing by its attorneys Quarles, Herriott, Clemons, Teschner & Noelke, by Laurence E. Gooding, Jr.; the respondent, Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, appearing by Assistant Attorney General Charles D. Hoornstra; and the Court having considered the matter fully upon the entire record, and having considered the written briefs and oral arguments of counsel for all parties, and the Court having filed its Memorandum Decision on February 7, 1974, reversing in its entirety the Order of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission dated March 7, 1973; and the Court being fully advised in the premises; now, therefore, on motion of petitioner,

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

1. That the Order of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, dated March 7, 1973, in the matter of Local 150, Service Employees International Union, AFL-CIO, Complainant, v. Appleton Memorial Hospital, Respondent, be and hereby is in its entirety reversed upon its merits and set aside.

2. That this matter is hereby remanded to the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, which shall dismiss upon its merits the complaint filed by Local 150, Service Employees International Union, AFL-CIO with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission against Appleton Memorial Hospital.
