NOW, THEREFORE, it is


ORDERED



MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING
ORDER DENYING REQUEST TO BE REMOVED FROM BALLOT

The facts relating to the motion of Wisconsin Council of County and Municipal Employees, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, hereinafter referred to as AFSCME, are set forth in the preface of the Commission's Order.

It should be noted that a lapse of 17 days occurred between the Direction of Election and the date upon which the Commission forwarded notices of the election, which contained a sample ballot, to all parties. In addition, approximately 11 days elapsed between the receipt of said notices and the date on which the election was originally scheduled. The election was timely postponed due to a snow storm, which made it impossible for the election agent to travel to Eau Claire to conduct the election, and new notices of the election were sent to the parties on April 13, 1973. AFSCME waited until 5 days prior to the date on which the election will now be conducted to advise the Commission that it desired to withdraw from the election. Since there is more than one union on the ballot, there still exists a question of representation among the employees involved, and we deem, under the circumstances described above, that AFSCME's motion requesting that it be removed from the ballot, filed at such a late date, would constitute an abuse of the Commission's processes, and, therefore, we are denying such motion.




