### DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Local 150, Service and Hospital Employees International Union, AFL-CIO, herein referred to as Petitioner, having filed a petition with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission requesting that an election be conducted pursuant to Section 111.05 of the Wisconsin Employment Peace Act among certain employes of St. Francis Hospital, herein referred to as the Employer, at its Milwaukee, Wisconsin location; and hearing in the matter having been conducted at Milwaukee, Wisconsin on May 30, 1973, before Stanley H. Michelstetter II, Hearing Officer; and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for certain employes of said Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

## DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within sixty (60) days from the date of this Directive in the collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time and all regular part-time employes of St. Francis Hospital, excluding casual, professional, supervisory, confidential, executive employes and members of the Order of Felician Sisters, who were employed by the Employer on May 26, 1973, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes desire to be represented by Local 150, Service and Hospital Employees International Union, AFL-CIO.

# MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

The Petitioner appeared at hearing and amended its petition to seek a unit consisting of:

All regular full-time and all regular part-time employes of St. Francis Hospital, excluding casual, professional, supervisory, confidential, executive employes and members of the Order of Felician Sisters.

The parties stipulated to the appropriateness of the unit.

The parties further stipulated that the professional employes are registered nurses, pharmacy employes, physical therapists, occupational therapists, registered medical technologist and surgical assistants; and that the casual employes are on-call employes and the temporary employes. We find such stipulations are consistent with the Wisconsin Employment Peace Act.

The parties stipulated that only members of the Order of Felician Sisters should be excluded from the unit and that members of other orders now employed are eligible, if they do not fall within the other exclusions.
