DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Local 305, affiliated with District Council 48, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election among certain employes of City of Wauwatosa; and hearing on such petition having been conducted on July 11, 1973, by Kay Hutchison, Hearing Officer; and the Commission having considered the evidence and positions of the parties, and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for certain employes of City of Wauwatosa;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within sixty (60) days from the date of this Directive among all Police Parketts but excluding all other employes who were employed by City of Wauwatosa on July 11, 1973, except such employes who quit their employment or are terminated for cause prior to the date of the election, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes desire to accrete to the existing collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time employes of the City of Wauwatosa employed in the Street Department, Mechanical and Maintenance Department, Electrical Department Water Department, and Park and Recreation Department, excluding seasonal employes, craft employes occupying the Electrician and Sign Painter classifications, executives and the following supervisors: General Street Foreman, Assistant Street Foreman, Equipment Foreman, City Electrician, Water Superintendent, Water Foreman, Park Superintendent and Forestry Foreman.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

In its petition, Local 305, affiliated with District 48, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, requested that the Commission conduct an election among the Police Parkettes employed by the City of Wauwatosa, hereinafter referred to as the Municipal Employer. During the hearing, the Petitioner expressed a desire that, in the event the Commission found the inclusion of said employes in an existing unit to be appropriate, an election be conducted among the Police Parkettes to determine whether they desire to accrete to the existing unit represented by the Petitioner.

The Petitioner is the certified collective bargaining representative of a unit consisting of: all regular full-time employes of the City of Wauwatosa employed in the Street Department, Mechanical and Maintenance Department, Electrical Department, Water Department, and Park and Recreation Department, excluding seasonal employes, craft employes occupying the Electrician and Sign Painter classifications, executives and the following supervisors: General Street Foreman, Assistant Street Foreman, Equipment Foreman, City Electrician, Water Superintendent, Water Foreman, Park Superintendent and Forestry Foreman. 1/

In addition, there are separate relevant collective bargaining units comprised of: all electricians and electrical technicians; all regular full-time and regular part-time Fire and Police Alarm Dispatchers; and sworn police officers of the Municipal Employer.

The duties of the three Police Parkettes, employed by the City of Wauwatosa, consist of issuing timed parking violation citations. Prior to January 1, 1973, the Police Parkettes were directly accountable to the Police-Fire Commission. In accordance with departmental rule established by the Police Chief, the Police Parkettes were sworn employes exercising limited powers of arrest.

Effective January 1, 1973, the City Council enacted an ordinance which abolished the sworn status of the Police Parkettes and placed them in the classified service subject to the rules and regulations of Civil Service.

The Municipal Employer argues that there is a possibility that the arrest powers of the Police Parkettes will be reinstated in accordance with the Police Chief's wishes. The Municipal Employer avers that it would be inappropriate to include sworn Police Parkettes in the existing collective bargaining unit represented by the Petitioner. Therefore, the Municipal Employer concludes that a unit consisting solely of Police Parkettes is the appropriate unit in which an election should be directed.

The Petitioner reasons that the Police Parkettes, as non-sworn employes, appropriately constitute either a separate unit or an accretion to the existing unit. The Petitioner argues that the Police Parkettes, possessing the power of arrest prior to January 1, 1973, were, thereby, ineligible for inclusion in the existing, overall unit initially established in 1962. The Commission is satisfied that a community of

As of the date of hearing of the instant proceeding, the conduct of an election was pending to determine whether all regular parttime and regular seasonal employes of the City of Wauwatosa desire to accrete to said existing unit.

interest is present between the existing collective bargaining unit and the Police Parkette positions. Furthermore, the statutory directive to avoid fragmentation is a relevant consideration in light of the limited number of Police Parkette positions.

The Commission concludes that it is appropriate to grant the Police Parkette an opportunity to determine for themselves whether they desire to accrete to the existing unit represented by the Petitioner. Should the required number of employes vote in favor of such accretion, the Commission will subsequently amend the present certification to reflect the accretion of the Police Parkettes.

However, in the event that the employes vote against accretion to the existing unit, the Commission will determine the Police Parkettes to have rejected representation for the purposes of collective bargaining and, thereby, dismiss the instant petition.

At such time as arrest powers are restored to the Police Parkettes, said positions shall automatically be excluded from the existing unit represented by the Petitioner. The Commission has consistently excluded sworn employes from inclusion in bargaining units with employes who do not possess the power of arrest. 2/
