ORDER AFFIRMING EXAMINER'S FINDINGS OF FACT,
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

Examiner Marshall L. Gratz having, on December 13, 1973, issued his Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, with Accompanying Memorandum, in the above entitled proceeding, wherein the above named Respondent was found to have committed, and was committing, unfair labor practices within the meaning of Sections 111.06(1)(f) and 111.06(1)(g) of the Wisconsin Employment Peace Act, and wherein the Respondent was ordered to cease and desist therefrom and to take certain affirmative action with respect thereto; and no petition for review of said Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, with Accompanying Memorandum, having been filed within the statutory period set forth in Section 111.07(5) of the Wisconsin Employment Peace Act; and the Commission having reviewed the entire record in the matter and being satisfied that the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, with Accompanying Memorandum, issued by the Examiner should be affirmed;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

ORDERED

That, pursuant to Section 111.07(5) of the Wisconsin Employment Peace Act, the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission hereby adopts the Examiner's Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, with Accompanying Memorandum, issued in the above entitled matter as its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, with Accompanying Memorandum, and, therefore, the Respondent, United Contractors, Inc., shall notify the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within ten (10) days of the receipt of a copy of this Order as to what steps it has taken to comply therewith.


