And the parties having agreed that certain modifications may be made to the order of the petitioner because of the respondent's compliance therewith,

And upon the record and file herein,

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the order of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission entered on the 30th day of August, 1974, in the proceedings before it identified there as Decision No. 12186-C, be, and the same hereby is, confirmed and enforced, as modified below, the court reserving jurisdiction to make such further order or judgment in the premises as may be necessary to give full force and effect to the order of the commission and the enforcement thereof on the evidence in the record or on the taking of such further evidence as appears to the court to be necessary, the present judgment and decree of the court to be deemed interlocutory as to those matters that may call for or require further action on the part of the court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the respondent City of Clintonville, its officers and agents, shall notify all employes by posting, in conspicuous places on its premises where notices to all employes are usually posted, copies of the notice attached hereto as Appendix A; said notice shall be signed by the Mayor of the City of Clintonville and by the President of the Board of Police and Fire Commissioners of the City of Clintonville immediately upon receipt of a copy of this judgment and order, and shall remain posted for sixty (60) days thereafter; and reasonable steps shall be taken by the respondent, its officers and agents, to insure that said notice is not altered, defaced or covered by other material.

APPENDIX A

Pursuant to an order of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, as confirmed and enforced by the Circuit Court of Waupaca County, and in order to effectuate the policies of the Municipal Employment Relations Act, we hereby notify our employes that:

- 1. We have, upon request, bargained collectively with Clintonville Professional Policemen's Association as the exclusive representative of all law enforcement personnel employed by the City of Clintonville, excluding supervisors, with respect to the imposition and enforcement of a residence requirement as a condition of employment and with respect to all other wages, hours and conditions of employment.
- We have made James R. Wockenfus whole for any loss of pay and benefits he 2. may have suffered by reason of the prohibited practices engaged in by the City of Clintonville.
- 3. We have rescinded any action to terminate the employment of James R. Wockenfus and have fulfilled our duty and obligation to bargain collectively with Clintonville Professional Policemen's Association concerning any residence requirement to be imposed upon members of the aforesaid collective bargaining unit on and after January 1, 1973.
- We will not interfere with, restrain or coerce our employes in the exercise of their right of selforganization, to form labor organizations, to join or assist Clintonville Professional Policemen's Association or any other labor organization, to bargain collectively through representatives of their own choosing, and to engage in other concerted activities for the purpose of collective bargaining or any mutual aid or protection.

All our employes are free to become, remain, or refrain from becoming members of Clintonville Professional Policemen's Association or any other labor organization.
