ORDER CLARIFYING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UNIT

City of Milwaukee, having filed a petition with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission wherein it requested the Commission to determine whether the position of Administrator, Boards and Commission, is included in the certified bargaining unit of certain employes in the employ of the City of Milwaukee; and a hearing on said petition having been held at Milwaukee, Wisconsin on May 22, 1974 before Zel S. Rice II, Commissioner; and the Commission being fully advised in the premises makes and issues the following

ORDER

The position of Administrator, Boards and Commissions, shall be and hereby is, excluded from the collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular professional engineers and architectural employes including Technicians IV, V, and VI employed by the City of Milwaukee, excluding all other employes, confidential employes, supervisory employes and executives employed by the City of Milwaukee.


