DIRECTION OF ELECTION

District Council 48 and its affiliated Local 1486, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, having filed a petition requesting the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission on May 8, 1974, to conduct an election pursuant to Section 111.70, Wisconsin Statutes, among certain employees of Joint Union High School District No. 1, et. al. hereinafter referred to as the Municipal Employer; and a hearing on such petition having been scheduled at Milwaukee, Wisconsin on June 25, 1974, before Stanley H. Michelstetter II, Hearing Officer, and the parties immediately prior thereto having stipulated that an election should be conducted, and having waived hearing on the matter; and the Commission being satisfied that a question of representation has arisen involving certain employees of the Municipal Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission be conducted on or within sixty (60) days thereafter, among all regular full-time and all regular part-time clerical employees and teaching aide employees employed by Joint Union High School District No. 1, excluding supervisory, confidential, managerial and executive employees, who will be employed on or before September 13, 1974, except such employees as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purposes of determining whether a majority of such employees desire to be represented for the purposes of collective bargaining with

the above named Municipal Employer on questions of wages, hours and conditions of employment by District Council 48 and its affiliated Local 1486, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, or by no organization.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Prior to the scheduled hearing, the parties stipulated that the unit in which we direct election today is appropriate. They further stipulated that the teaching aide assigned to assist the school nurse should be included in such unit, that the District Administrator's secretary and School Board's administrative secretary are confidential employees and that the Data Processing Supervisor who controls a budget of approximately \$25,000 and supervises such department should be excluded as supervisory/managerial. We find no inconsistency with our policy in such stipulations.

The parties indicated that the school year will commence in early September and at that time the Municipal Employer will be hiring and rehiring employees in the instant unit. The parties jointly requested that the eligibility date be set as September 13, 1974, the first payday of the school year, in order to have the employees who will be working for the entire school year on the eligibility list. The Municipal Employer has agreed to provide a list of employees in the unit positions as of that date with a copy of such list to the Union at the same time as it is forwarded to us. The parties further requested that the election be conducted on the next following payday, October 1, 1974, or as soon thereafter as follows.


Since there were no further matters, the parties waived hearing.


