The above consolidated matters having come on for hearing before the court upon the petitions of the petitioners above-named for a review of an order of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, and on the counter-petition of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission for enforcement of the same order:

and the court having considered the matter upon the record and written arguments of counsel, and having on the 27th day of January, 1981, filed its decision in writing, now, on motion,

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the order of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, entered on May 8, 1979, in the matter of "Northwest United Educators & Norris Rawhouser, Complainants, v. Cooperative Educational Service Agency No. 4, et al., Respondents, Case II, No. 18382, MP-400, Decision No. 13100-G," be, and the same hereby is, confirmed and enforced, the court reserving jurisdiction to make such further order or judgment in the premises as may be necessary to give full force and effect to the said order of the Commission and the enforcement thereof on the evidence in the record or on the taking of such further evidence as appears to the court to be necessary, the present order and judgment of the court to be deemed interlocutory as to those matters that may call for or require further action on the part of the court.
