DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Retail Store Employees Union, Local 444, AFL-CIO, having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election among certain employees of Stan's Bootery, Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and a hearing on such petition having been held at Milwaukee, Wisconsin on April 7, 1975, and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for certain employees of the Employer named above;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is


DIRECTED


That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within thirty (30) days from the date of this Directive among all regular full-time and regular part-time employees of Stan's Bootery, excluding, confidential employees, contract manager and other supervisory employees, and managerial employees, who were employed on May 9, 1975, except such employees as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employees desire to be represented for the purpose of collective bargaining by Retail Store Employees Union, Local 444, AFL-CIO.


MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING


