DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Retail Store Employees Union, Local 444, AFL-CIO, having petitioned the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to conduct an election among certain employes of Stan's Bootery, Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and a hearing on such petition having been held at Milwaukee, Wisconsin on April 7, 1975, and the Commission having considered the evidence and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation for certain employes of the Employer named above;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within thirty (30) days from the date of this Directive among all regular full-time and regular part-time employes of Stan's Bootery, excluding, confidential employes, contract manager and other supervisory employes, and managerial employes, who were employed on May 9, 1975, except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employes desire to be represented for the purpose of collective bargaining by Retail Store Employees Union, Local 444, AFL-CIO.
