MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

In their stipulation the parties also requested the Commission to conduct a referendum to determine whether the required number of employes in the unit involved favored an "All-Union Agreement" between the Employer and the Union. The Wisconsin Employment Peace Act does not require that a referendum be conducted in order for the employer and union to enter into an "All-Union Agreement", where the union has been selected as the bargaining representative in an election conducted by the Commission or the National Labor Relations Board, and therefore the Commission is not directing a referendum in the matter.
