DIRECTION OF ELECTION

The Union and the Employer named above having filed a stipulation with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, requesting the Commission to conduct an election among certain employes of the above named Employer, pursuant to Sec. 111.05, Wis. Stats.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS DIRECTED that an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission in the collective bargaining unit consisting of

All mechanics employed by Wausau Truck Sales, Inc., Wausau, Wisconsin, excluding office clerical, Parts Department personnel, supervisors, managers, salesmen and guards as so defined, who were employed by the Employer on August 27, 1975,

except such employes as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether the required number of such employes desire to be represented by the above named Union for the purposes of collective bargaining with the Employer named above.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION

In their stipulation the parties also requested the Commission to conduct a referendum to determine whether the required number of employees in the unit involved favored an "All-Union Agreement" between the Employer and the Union. The Wisconsin Employment Peace Act does not require that a referendum be conducted in order for the employees and union to enter into an "All-Union Agreement", where the union has been selected as the bargaining representative in an election conducted by the Commission or the National Labor Relations Board, and therefore the Commission is not directing a referendum in the matter.
