DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Fire Fighters Local 2477, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, having on December 15, 1975, filed a petition with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission requesting the Commission to conduct an election, pursuant to Section 111.70(4)(d) of the Municipal Employment Relations Act, among certain employees of the Town of Allouez (Fire Department) to determine whether said employees desire to be represented by said Petitioner for the purposes of collective bargaining; and a hearing on said petition having been conducted on January 13, 1976 at Green Bay, Wisconsin, Sherwood Malamud, Hearing Officer, being present; and the Commission having considered the evidence and being fully advised in the premises and being satisfied that a question has arisen concerning representation of certain employees of said Municipal Employer;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission within thirty (30) days from the date of this Directive in the collective bargaining unit consisting of all fire fighter employees employed by the Town of Allouez Fire Department, excluding the Fire Chief and Fire Captains, who were employed on January 13, 1976, except such employees as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether a majority of such employees desire to be represented by Fire Fighters Local 2477, for the purpose of collective bargaining with the Town of Allouez (Fire Department).




MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DIRECTION OF ELECTION


During the course of the hearing conducted on January 13, 1976, the parties stipulated to the description of the unit described in the Directive. They stipulated, as well, to the employees eligible to vote in the election. However, the parties were unable to agree to the inclusion/exclusion of a part-time employee, Jeffrey Hamilton, in the unit. The parties agreed to proceed with the election and have the dispute concerning Jeffrey Hamilton determined by the Commission by challenged ballot.
