CERTIFICATION OF RESULTS OF REFERENDUM

Pursuant to a Direction of Referendum previously issued, the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission conducted a referendum among certain employes of Marathon County to determine whether the required number of the employes employed in the collective bargaining unit set forth in the Commission's Direction favored the implementation of a "fair-share agreement" between the parties named above.

The result of the referendum was as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of and pursuant to the power vested in the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission by Section 111.70(1)(h) and (2) of the Municipal Employment Relations Act;

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the required number of the employes employed in the collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time deputies or clerks employed by the Marathon County Sheriff's Department, excluding the Sheriff, Chief Deputy, Lieutenants, Sergeants, Safety Director, and part-time employes, voted in favor of the implementation of a "fair-share agreement" between Marathon County and Marathon County Deputy Sheriff's Association.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING CERTIFICATION OF RESULTS OF ELECTION

Pursuant to the provision in the collective bargaining agreement existing between the parties, a "fair-share agreement" would become effective provided two-thirds of the employes voting voted in favor of the "fair-share agreement", and further providing that said two-thirds constituted a majority of the employes in the unit. At least two-thirds of the employes voting voted in favor of the "fair-share agreement". Further, said two-thirds (23) constitutes a majority of the employes eligible (44). Therefore, the conditions for the implementation of the "fair-share agreement" have been met.
