

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING ORDER DENYING MOTION
TO MAKE COMPLAINT MORE DEFINITE AND CERTAIN

Complainants filed their complaint on May 31, 1977. The Examiner served a copy of said complaint on the representatives of the Respondent Union on June 7, 1977. Thereafter on June 21, 1977, Respondent Union filed a Motion To Make Complaint More Definite And Certain. The Commission, in its rules at ERB 12.03(3), established in regard to a Motion To Make Complaint More Definite And Certain that:

"If a complaint is alleged to be so indefinite as to hamper the respondent or any other party in the preparation of its answer to the complaint, such party may, within 5 days after the service of the complaint, by motion request the commission to order the complainant to file a statement supplying specified information to make the complaint more definite and certain."

Therefore, the Examiner has denied Respondent Union's Motion To Make Complaint More Definite And Certain because it was not timely filed according to the above rule.
