ORDER AND JUDGMENT

The above-entitled matter having come on for hearing before the Court upon the motion for remedial sanction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission to terminate the respondent's continuing contempt of court, namely, respondent's intentional disobedience to the judgment of the Court which was duly entered in this proceeding on December 2, 1991, which affirmed and enforced the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order of the Commission; petitioner, Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, appearing by James E. Doyle, Attorney General, and John D. Niemisto, Assistant Attorney General; respondent, T & J Komp Electric Company and Theodore Komp appearing by Smith & Sarafiny, by George E. Smith; Local Union 494, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, appearing by John J. Brennan; and the Court having considered the motion upon the record and written and oral arguments of counsel entered the following order:

That there shall be due the sum of, in total, \$5,092.72 plus Statutory interest,...from the date of the grievance award....

That the sum of \$3,000 shall be paid into an interest-bearing trust account of Attorney Brennan to be held by him until complete payment has been made. That \$3,000 is a first payment and shall be made on or about the 1st day of October, 1992. That the balance shall be due, together with any remaining interest, interest to be computed at that time less the \$3,000 credit. Final payment to be made on or before December 1st, 1992.

Additionally, as and for remedial sanctions, this Court shall impose a [forfeiture in the amount of] \$50 per day for each day that there is not payment pursuant to this Order.
