**NOTICE OF COMMISSION'S FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSION OF LAW  
AND ORDER PURSUANT TO SECTION 111.07(5), STATS.**

On March 11, 1999 Examiner Lionel L. Crowley issued Findings of Fact, Conclusion of Law and Order, with Accompanying Memorandum, in the above-entitled matter determining that the above-named Respondent had committed prohibited practices within the meaning of Sec. 111.70(3)(a)5, Stats. He therefore ordered Respondent to cease and desist from said violations and to take certain affirmative action.
