DIRECTION OF ELECTION

Milwaukee Teachers' Education Association, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, having filed a petition with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, requesting the Commission to conduct an election, pursuant to § 111.70(4)(d)3.b., Stats., among employees in the substitute teacher bargaining unit, to determine whether said employees want to be represented by the Petitioner for the purposes of collective bargaining; and the election having been held and the Association having filed objections to the conduct of the election; and it having been determined that more than 100 eligible voters had not been included on the voter list used in the election, and the Commission being satisfied that a new election should be conducted;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

DIRECTED

That an election by secret ballot shall be conducted under the direction of the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission among employees in the substitute teacher bargaining unit who worked at least 30 days during the 2013-2014 school year, including May 5, 2014, except such employees¹ as may prior to the election quit their employment or be discharged for cause, for the purpose of determining whether at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the employees want to continue to be represented by the Milwaukee Teachers' Education Association for the purposes of collective bargaining with the Milwaukee Public Schools.
