**NOTICE OF COMMISSION'S FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF
LAW AND ORDER PURSUANT TO § 111.07(5), STATS.**

On May 20, 2016, Examiner Peter G. Davis issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order with Accompanying Memorandum in the above-captioned matter determining that the State of Wisconsin, Department of Health Services had committed an unfair labor practice within the meaning of § 111.84(1)(a), Stats. He ordered DHS to take certain remedial action.¹ The Examiner also determined that DHS had not committed an unfair labor practice within the meaning of § 111.84(1)(c), Stats., and dismissed that allegation.

Within the 20-day statutory period set forth in § 111.07(5), Stats., no petition for review of said Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order was filed and no intervening order by the Examiner or the Commission was issued.
