¹ Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § ERC 70.04, if no collective bargaining agreement was in effect as of the date of this Order, Petitioner is no longer the collective bargaining representative as of that date, and the employees must remain unrepresented for the purposes of collective bargaining for a minimum of one year. If a collective bargaining agreement was in effect as of the date of this Order, Petitioner loses its status as the bargaining representative once that agreement expires and the employees must remain unrepresented for the purposes of collective bargaining for a minimum of one year from said expiration.
