CERTIFICATION OF RESULTS OF ELECTION

Pursuant to a Direction of Election previously issued by it in the above-captioned matter, the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, on April 21, 2020, conducted an election pursuant to § 111.70(4)(d)3.b. of the Municipal Employment Relations Act to determine whether employees of Village of Merrilan in the DPW/Clerical collective bargaining unit set forth in the Commission's Direction, wanted to continue to be represented by the General Teamsters Union Local No. 662 for the purposes of collective bargaining with Village of Merrilan.

The result of the election was as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of and pursuant to the power vested in the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission by § 111.70(4)(d)3.b. of the Municipal Employment Relations Act;

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the employees in the DPW/Clerical bargaining unit failed to select the General Teamsters Union Local No. 662 to continue as their bargaining representative.¹

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that:

1. If no collective bargaining agreement is currently in effect, the General Teamsters Union Local No. 662 is no longer the collective bargaining representative as of the date of this Certification. If a collective bargaining agreement is currently in effect, the General Teamsters Union Local No. 662 ceases to be the collective bargaining representative as of the date that agreement expires.

2. For a minimum of one year from the applicable date in (1) above, the employees shall not be included in a substantially similar collective bargaining unit.
