IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the Mosinee Education Association, WEAC Region 2 has been selected by at least fifty-one percent (51%) of all eligible employees in the collective bargaining unit consisting of all regular full-time and regular part-time professional employees of the School District of Mosinee, excluding managerial, confidential and supervisory employees, as their representative; and that pursuant to the provisions of § 111.70(4)(d) of the Municipal Employment Relations Act said Labor Organization is the exclusive collective bargaining representative of all such employees for the purpose of collective bargaining with the Mosinee School District.
