ARBITRATION AWARD

Oshkosh Public Library Employees, Local 796-A, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, hereinafter referred to as the Union, and the City of Oshkosh, hereinafter referred to as the City, are parties to a collective bargaining agreement which provides for the final and binding arbitration of disputes arising thereunder. The parties mutually agreed to the undersigned as the arbitrator to hear and decide a grievance over the meaning and application of the terms of the collective bargaining agreement. A hearing was held in Oshkosh, Wisconsin on June 5, 2000, during the course of which a resolution of the instant grievance was agreed to by the parties, which by its terms, causes the undersigned to make and issue the following

CONSENT AWARD

- 1. The Union will withdraw the bookmobile operator grievances with prejudice. This would include grievances 983 and 997.
- 2. The library will normally assign two employees to the bookmobile for full public service stops. A reasonable effort will be made to

locate a substitute within the circulation department in the event an employee is absent. In the event a substitute cannot be found, the Union agrees that one employee may be assigned to the bookmobile to perform the available work after a supervisor consults with the employe. In the event a page is assigned to the bookmobile as substitute, it will be done on a non-precedent setting basis and the page will be paid at the LA-1 rate for the time assigned to the bookmobile.

- 3. The library reserves the right to schedule LA-1's on a regular basis on the bookmobile.
 - 4. LA-1's will do LA-1 work on the bookmobile.
