Opinion

This is an appeal from the reallocation action of the Director of the State Bureau of Personnel.

Appellant is employed by the University of Wisconsin at Stevens Point as a locksmith, a profession he has pursued since 1953. As the result of a maintenance survey conducted in the spring of 1972, Appellant was reallocated from his classification as a Building and Grounds Repairman (SR 3-08) to the newly created classification of Locksmith 2 (SR 3-08), effective April 29, 1973. His appeal to this Board followed.

It is Appellant's contention that his work responsibilities warrant his classification as a Locksmith 3. A Locksmith 3 is distinguished from a Locksmith 2 primarily "by the fact that the work requires the fabrication of lock parts using a lathe, milling machine and drill press on a continuing basis." (Respondent's Exhibit #3.) Thus, the question becomes whether Appellant in his work, at the time of the reallocation, could be said, 1) to fabricate locks parts, 2) using a lathe, milling machine and drill press, 3) on a continuing basis.


ORDER
