DECISION AND ORDER

In a letter to the Commission dated July 10, 1984, the appellant sought to appeal the decision to assign the Field Warden classification to pay range 5-12 rather than 5-13. In a subsequent telephone conversation with a member of the Commission staff, the appellant stated that he did not feel that his position, which had been reallocated to the Conservation Warden 3 level, should have been reallocated to a higher classification level.

The responsibilities for making changes in the classification specifications and assigning (and reassigning) classes to pay ranges all rest with the Secretary of the Department of Employment Relations. Section 230.09(2)(am) and (b), Stats., (1984). While the Personnel Commission can review classification and reallocation decisions made by the Secretary under \$230.09(2)(a) and (d), Stats., (1984), the Commission lacks the authority to review a decision assigning a classification to a particular pay range. In light of the fact that you have stated this is the sole issue you are raising in your appeal, the appeal must be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction.
