DECISION AND ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DISMISS

By letter dated March 18, 2014, Appellant Mary Ruhland sought to appeal the decision of the Office of the State Employment Relations ("OSER") not to process her grievance over her termination by the Educational Approval Board ("EAB"). The EAB moved to dismiss the appeal by motion on April 16, 2014. The matter has been briefed and is ready for decision.

DECISION AND ORDER

It is undisputed that Ruhland was in probationary status at the time of her discharge from employment. Our jurisdiction to review termination decisions is limited to circumstances where the employee had "permanent status in class" at the time of the decision. ¹

Ruhland makes a convoluted argument that she was denied due process because her grievance was not processed and, in turn, should justify our review. The argument borders on being frivolous but suffice it to say that a probationary discharge is not subject to review under the grievance process and, by definition, probationary employees enjoy no procedural due process rights. Accordingly, we enter the following:

ORDER

That the appeal of Mary Ruhland is dismissed.
