Ms. Jackson was discharged on July 29, 2014. On August 25, 2014, she sought a direct appeal to the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission. The Respondent Wisconsin Department of Children and Families ("DCF") has moved to dismiss or, in the alternative, to remand this matter for processing under the Wisconsin Human Resources Handbook. DCF has submitted a brief in support of its position.

The Commission having duly considered the matter, issues the following

DECISION AND ORDER

As a result of action by the Wisconsin Legislature, we no longer have jurisdiction over direct appeals from adverse employment decisions involving discipline or discharge. We are limited to reviewing those decisions as the final step in the grievance procedure. Thus, in order to gain access to our review, an appellant must exhaust the grievance procedure.

Accordingly, we issue the following

ORDER

This matter is remanded to the DCF with directions to treat the appeal as a timely filed step one grievance. If the matter is not resolved through the grievance procedure, Jackson may file an appeal to this agency within the specified time limits.
