## DECISION AND ORDER DENYING MOTION TO DISMISS

The employee, Jason Siminow, is appealing a one-day disciplinary suspension, and there is no dispute with regard to our jurisdiction over the claim. There also is no dispute that Siminow satisfied the required conditions precedent to this claim. Sometime after receiving the one-day suspension, Siminow was permanently transferred from the Sheboygan office to the Saukville office. Accepting his version of events (as we must on a motion to dismiss), the permanent transfer was a punitive measure connected to the events which led to the one-day suspension. The State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections moves to dismiss arguing that Siminow has failed to allege facts sufficient to state a claim for constructive demotion.

### DECISION

In *Wasmer v. DOJ*, Dec. No. 36176 (WERC, 2016), we held that a claim of constructive demotion may arise out of an employer's punitive decision to transfer an employee to a geographically distant work location. The punitive motivation may be proven by direct evidence or by evidence of a lack of legitimate business purpose for the transfer. While it is

true that Siminow's "amendment" lacks much in the way of specifics, we liberally construe pro se documents.

While we are allowing Siminow's "amendment," we recognize that he faces an uphill battle in his effort to establish that the move in office assignment is in fact punitive. The distance involved is not particularly onerous. Nevertheless, we will permit Siminow's effort to prove this claim.

## ORDER

The motion to dismiss is denied.
