ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DISMISS

On September 28, 2018, DCF filed a motion to dismiss the appeal for lack of jurisdiction. That same day, Taylor filed a response opposing the motion.

MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DISMISS

Erin Taylor's appeal asserts she was promised but did not receive a wage increase. The State admits that DCF erroneously advised Taylor that she would receive a wage increase. Nonetheless, the State moves to dismiss the appeal because the Commission lacks jurisdiction to consider the error. Taylor contends the Commission should hear the matter under the doctrine of promissory estoppel.

The Commission's jurisdiction is established and limited by statute. As argued by the State, the Commission's civil service jurisdiction over wage matters is limited to an alleged reduction in base wage under § 230.44(1)(c), Stats. Here, because the wage increase was never received, it could not have been a "reduction." *See also Schneider v DOC*, Dec. No. 35678 (WERC, 3/15).

As the State also notes, the Commission's jurisdiction over employee grievances under 230.45(1)(c), Stats. does not include wage issues.

While Taylor may have a promissory estoppel claim in another forum, the Commission does not have such jurisdiction and therefore the appeal has been dismissed.
