## **DECISION AND ORDER DENYING MOTION TO DISMISS**

On August 23, 2020, Jill Kollmann filed an appeal with the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission alleging she had been discharged without just cause by the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections (DOC). On August 28, 2020, DOC filed a motion to dismiss the appeal asserting that Kollmann was a probationary employee who therefore lacked just cause civil service protections. On September 1, 2020, Kolmann filed a response in opposition to the motion, asserting that she had obtained permanent status in class and thus had civil service protections. On September 11, 2020, DOC filed a reply.

Having considered the matter, the Commission makes and issues the following:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is:

#### **ORDERED**

The motion to dismiss is denied.

# MEMORANDUM ACCOMPANYING DECISION AND ORDER DENYING MOTION TO DISMISS

When making a determination on the merits of a motion to dismiss, an appeal must be construed in the light most favorable to the appellant. *See* Weber v. DWD, Dec. No. 34657 (WERC, 11/13). Viewed in the light most favorable to Kollmann, a hearing is needed to determine if she had permanent status in class and, if so, whether DOC has just cause to discharge her.

Therefore, the motion to dismiss is denied.
