**CERTIFICATION OF REPRESENTATIVE**

Pursuant to a Direction of Election previously issued by it in the above-captioned matter, the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission, on December 2, 2024, conducted an election, pursuant to § 111.83(1) of the State Employment Labor Relations Act, to determine whether employees of the State of Wisconsin, in the collective bargaining unit set forth in the Commission's Direction, desired to be represented by the Wisconsin Association of State Prosecutors, for the purpose of collective bargaining with the State of Wisconsin.

The tally of ballots provided to the parties indicated that the Prosecutors had not received enough votes to become the collective bargaining representative.

Shortly thereafter, the State Prosecutors timely filed objections to the election asserting that certain ballots received after December 2, 2024, should be opened and counted. The State of Wisconsin agreed and on December 30, 2024, the Commission issued an Order advising the parties that certain additional ballots would be opened and counted on January 2, 2025. Said ballots were opened and counted on January 2, 2025, and those additional ballots have been added to those counted on December 2, 2024.

The result of the election is now as follows:

1.	Total number eligible to vote	424
2.	Total ballots cast	236
3.	Total valid ballots counted	236
4.	Ballots cast for Wisconsin Association of State Prosecutors	234
5.	Ballots cast for no representation	2

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of and pursuant to the power vested in the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission by § 111.83(1) of the State Employment Labor Relations Act;

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the Wisconsin Association of State Prosecutors has been selected by at least fifty-one percent (51%) of all eligible employees in the collective bargaining unit consisting of all Assistant District Attorneys, excluding DAs, DDAs and special prosecutors, as their representative; and that pursuant to the provisions of § 111.83(1) of the State Employment Labor Relations Act said Labor Organization is the exclusive collective bargaining representative of all such employees for the purpose of collective bargaining with the State of Wisconsin.
